Message From Our Chairman (Erin Byars)

Square dancing saved my life. That may sound dramatic, but it is the truth.

In school I was possibly the most unpopular person enrolled. Then, I began square dancing. All the dancers in my teen club went to other schools and didn't know they were supposed to hate me. I developed an entirely new circle of friends, many of whom I am still close to 54 years later!

How many young people today suffer from low self esteem and bullying? How many might be saved by the miracle that is square dancing? From many I hear that young people are not interested in square dancing, but what about that kid that has been shoved aside and ignored? This could be a new start for them.

Many say they have tried to start programs in their local schools but can't seem to get the administration interested. But what if your ducks were lined up all nice and pretty?

Below I am sharing a proposal written by caller Rachel Phillips of California in 2004. (Please be aware this was composed 19 years ago, but the information should still be valid.) The following comparison and analysis was prepared by Rachel H. Phillips, a credentialed teacher with 28 years teaching experience, for the Administration at Roosevelt Junior High in Modesto, California, in the Fall of 2004.

SQUARE DANCE AND THE CALIFORNIA PHYSICAL EDUCATION STANDARDS

STANDARD 1: The student will be competent in many movement activities. A square dance unit, called a tip, is made up of many body movements in the form of choreography.

STANDARD 2: The student will understand how and why one moves in a variety of situations a n d will use this information to enhance his or her skills. In square dance, each move is done a specific way, allowing the dancer to be in position for the next movement.

STANDARD 3: The student will achieve and maintain a health-enhancing level of physical fitness. Square dance offers aerobic exercise that

raises the heart rate, strengthens muscles, burns calories, increases coordination, and reduces stress.

STANDARD 4: The student will exhibit a physically active lifestyle and will understand that physical activity provides opportunities for enjoyment, challenge, and self-expression. Square dance can be a lifetime activity, offering first the student and then the adult one avenue of maintaining a healthy and physically active lifestyle. Square dance offers many levels: basic, mainstream, plus, A-1, A-2, and Challenge level. The National Square Dance Association claims that those who square dance on a regular basis increase their life span by ten years.

STANDARD 5: The student will demonstrate responsible personal behavior while participating in movement activities. The square dance student must abide by the rules of the activity as outlined by the National Square Dance Association and adopted at the local level. All participants of a square must follow these guidelines if the dance is to be successful. (teamwork)

STANDARD 6: The student will demonstrate responsible social behavior while participating in movement activities. The student will understand the importance of respect for all others. By following established guidelines in a team activity, social behavior, mutual respect and etiquette is acquired. All members of a square must act in a responsible manner or the other seven dancers will not succeed in the choreographed figure.

STANDARD 7: The student will understand the interrelationship between history, culture, games, sports, play, and dance. Students will be exposed to the origins of the American Square Dance including its historical European components. Students will understand other countries have their own folk dance, and square dance has become the American folk dance.

With this analysis in hand schools should find square dancing a program worth including in their curriculums. Go forth and spread square dance joy!

UPDATE! Video Promotion Project (TV and Online)

As we have reported in past issues, The ARTS supports a project to produce short videos which would be compatible to post online and for TV broadcast. These videos will support marketing & promotion. **Michael Streby** has taken the lead for this project. The plan is for videos to be designed to provide information about why the public should learn to square dance and how to find lessons or dance locations.

We are pleased to report the project is on track and initial production has begun. Michael reports the video will be available for public viewing during the 72nd NSDC in Mobile, AL in June 2023

Michael reports the goal is to create 90-second to 2-minute videos to be posted on line. Videos would also be compatible for TV broadcast. The plan includes paying to market to our demographic target which is 55-75-year olds. Apparently, the cost can be limited to pay only for actual downloads & views. One of the goals is to get VERY wide exposure to the videos, especially the non-dancing public. Square Dancers are also encouraged to upload and share the videos along with their class schedule to any pages that they have the rights to post to.

The videos will be scripted to include health-related data. **Doctor Douglas Lee** discusses the many health benefits of dancing. Including why square dancing is one of the best forms of regaining and continuing a healthy life style.

This project will require considerable funding. We ask ALL dancers, callers, cuers, and others to consider either a cash donation earmarked for this project OR one of the other donation possibilities.

There are several versions of each of four ads:

- 1. Email version (sample) -- the sample version gives an example of how the groups information could be placed on the ad.
- 2. JPEGs. This version is also suitable for posting on social networks such as FaceBook
- 3. Print version (sample) -- this version is designed to print two half-size flyers on 8.5 x 11
- 4. Print version -- the 2-up print version with space for individual group information
- 5. Print version BW (sample) -- same as #3 in black and white
- 6. Print version BW -- same as #4 in black and white

NEWS FROM ARTS BOARD MEMBER ALL JOIN HANDS

As the pandemic began to ebb, All Join Hands began providing financial support to IAGSDC member clubs. Since 2020, AJH has invested \$56,000 in member clubs to help get them back to dancing through COVID Relief Funds, \$500 Stimulus to full member clubs, paying IAGSDC Club Dues for 2021 and 2022, and funding Club Development managed by the IAGSDC.

After two silent years, we celebrated again with a convention in Minneapolis. Social media lists an ever-growing number of clubs dancing and hosting fly-ins; things are getting better. We are still a long way from where we were.
